General Details for All Awards

- 1. Students receive the highest award for which they qualify. Awards are adjusted as new, official test scores or transcripts are received.
- 2. Scholarship recipients must maintain full-time enrollment (12 undergraduate hours; 9 graduate hours) each semester and be able to demonstrate lawful presence in the US.
 - Note: An exception can be made if a student has an approved Reduced Course Load from the Office of International Education and Services.

¹SAT (Evidence-based Reading & Writing + Math) = tests taken since March 2016.

²For graduates of high school where English is recognized as the medium of instruction, an ACT or SAT score AND GPA are required to qualify for scholarships. However, scholarships for applicants with one of the following results will be determined solely on the GPA we calculate from their results. No additional test is required.

³The value of the IAA varies based on actual enrollment and will be reduced for less than 15 hours per semester.

⁴The test score/language requirement is waived for students with 24+ transferable hours from a college where English is the sole medium of instruction.

- 3. Students are ineligible if awarded a scholarship intended to cover tuition & fees from any outside or institutional sources (e.g. graduate assistantships, government sponsorship, etc.).
- 4. Students are ineligible for all international scholarships if they become a Missouri Resident for fee paying purposes or receive the Nonresident Alumni Award.
- 5. The total amount of aid received from federal, state, institutional and other sources may not exceed the University established cost of attendance. Therefore, awarded scholarship amounts may be subject to reduction.
- 6. Undergraduate/graduate awards apply only to a first bachelor's/master's degree.
- 7. Academic & participation scholarships are awarded to non-U.S. citizens with lawful presence in the U.S. and the right per their visa status to enroll in a full-time course of study. Other students may still qualify for endowed scholarships each year.
- 8. All scholarship deadlines referenced are based on the month & day of the year immediately preceding the scholarship award year.
- 9. Incoming students who have earned less than 24 credit hours of college credit (excluding dual credit/early college credit) are only eligible for freshmen awards, while those who have earned 24 or more credit hours are only eligible for transfer awards.
 - Note: Scholarships may be revised after an initial award if the number of completed hours differs from the scholarship criteria, at the time a student begins at Southeast.

Scholarship Eligibility

INTERNATIONAL ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE AWARDS are awarded to regularly admitted beginning freshmen.

- **Deadline:** Fall applicants must apply for admission by March 1. Spring applicants must apply for admission by November 1.
- Standardized Tests: Applicants must meet one test requirement listed on the chart above. Note: June test scores (fall admits) and November test scores (spring admits) will be the latest test scores considered.
- GPA: Applicants must have a 3.75+ cumulative high school GPA

INTERNATIONAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS are awarded to regularly admitted beginning freshmen & transfer students at the time of admission.

- **Deadline:** There is no admission deadline or separate application required.
- Standardized Tests: Applicants must meet one test requirement listed on the chart above.

 Note: March test scores (fall admits) and December test scores (spring admits) will be the latest test scores considered.
- **GPA:** Applicants must have a 3.25+ cumulative high school GPA (freshman) or 3.0+ transferable college GPA (transfer students).

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS are awarded to regularly admitted beginning freshmen & transfer students at the time of admission.

- **Deadline:** There is no admission deadline or separate application required.
- **GPA:** Undergraduate applicants must have a 2.5+ cumulative high school GPA (freshman) or transferable college GPA (transfer & graduate students). Graduate applicants must have a 3.0+ Undergraduate GPA.

Additional Eligibility Details:

- 1. Cumulative GPA requirements are based on a 4.0 scale.
- 2. Transfer students must have 24+ transferable hours from a 2-year or 4-year college or university. GPA requirements are evaluated based on a final transcript showing transferable hours.

¹Minimum Hour Requirement – Students must earn the required number of hours during the scholarship year for the award to renew for an additional year. All hours must be taken through Southeast and summer hours are permitted toward renewal criteria.

²GPA Requirement – Southeast cumulative grade point averages are evaluated at the end of the scholarship year and will include Southeast summer hours (if applicable). Transfer and dual credit coursework are not included for renewal.

Additional Renewal Details:

- 1. Students who do not renew their scholarship for the upcoming scholarship year may request reinstatement of the scholarship after they have attended Southeast for one full year without the scholarship, to include fall, spring, (and summer, if needed). Students are required to complete the same number of credit hours and achieve the same Southeast cumulative GPA that was stated in the scholarship's renewal criteria when first awarded.
- 2. All scholarships are renewable each year through the renewal period (shown above) or until completion of course work for a bachelor's degree, whichever occurs first, providing students meet the hour and GPA requirements. Returning students (i.e. students who attend Southeast, leave to attend another institution, and return to Southeast) are no longer eligible for scholarship renewal as they are no longer within the renewal period of 4 consecutive academic years.
- Students who do not meet the renewal criteria for the International Academic Excellence awards will be defaulted to the International Achievement Award should the lower renewal criteria be met.
