**Quality Online Course Work:** This program is designed for someone who does not have an undergraduate degree in education or a teaching certificate. It leads to an initial teaching certificate in Mild/Moderate Cross Categorical (Kindergarten – 12<sup>th</sup> grade), allowing students to earn both a Master's degree and a teaching certification in special education. The MAT program in Exceptional Child Education has 53 credit hours of online course work, including two 1-credit hour field experiences and a 12-week student teaching practicum. It may be completed in seven semesters, with part-time enrollment. All online courses have been reviewed and are Quality Matters approved.
