Motion by Weller-Stilson, second by Randolph, to consider and approve the changes to the BME Instrumental and BME Vocal. Nick Kenney described the justification for revisions. Pujol stated that the proposal had not been approved by the College of Education, Health, and Human Studies College Council and therefore could

not be considered by Academic Council yet. Discussion followed on returning the proposal in Workflow to the College Council for consideration.

A motion was made to suspend the rules. The proposal will be returned to the EHHS College Council for consideration, and the motion may then be presented to the Academic Council as a special electronic vote pending EHHS College Council's approval. The motion was approved unanimously.

Motion by Pujol, second by Hinkle, to consider and approve the changes to the AA in Child Care and Guidance. Sarah Kuborn described the justification for revisions. Discussion followed. A suggestion was made to consider reducing the degree in the future to 60 credit hours. The motion was approved unanimously.

Motion by Pujol, second by Dickson, to consider and approve the changes to the MA in Exceptional Child Education. Dixie McCollum described the justification for revisions and the changes being made. Discussion followed. The motion was approved unanimously.

 - a. Program Change: BSBA Business Administration
 - Course changes

Motion by Dickson, second by Weller-Stilson, to consider and approve the changes to the BSBA in Business Administration. Kevin Dickson described the justification for revisions for this proposal and the other following BSBA degrees proposal changes, and the history of these changes. These changes are proposed based on the potential of two QM (257 & 258) courses that may be deleted. The faculty voted to move forward with the proposals even if the courses are not deleted. These two QM courses were moved from support courses to the majors. Moutusi Maity described the revisions for the BSBA Business Administration. A question was raised why the new MK550 and BA550 courses seem to be duplicate courses, which was the impetus for original course deletions. Randolph raised the question of why numerous specific mathematics courses were included to replace the QM courses rather than the course that was found to contain the content of those courses. Dickson made a friendly amendment to remove the MK550 course from the proposal, and Weller-Stilson accepted the amendment. 13 voted in favor and 1 opposed. The motion is approved.
