The Master of Arts in Exceptional Child Education at Southeast Missouri State University is an online graduate degree that offers three emphasis areas: Mild/Moderate Cross-Categorical, Autism, and Early Childhood Special Education. This program is designed to support general classroom teachers in their work with students with special needs in their classroom, help special education teachers deepen their teaching skills and knowledge in their field of expertise, or offer additional teaching certification. *This graduate program does not lead to an initial teaching certificate but does offer an add-on MO teaching certificate in Early Childhood Special Education.* The graduate program in Exceptional Child Education has 30 credit hours of online course work, making the program convenient for busy classroom teachers.

Admission Requirements

1. An undergraduate grade point average of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale
2. A valid professional teaching certificate OR a qualifying score on the state content exam appropriate for that certificate OR be in the 50th percentile verbal and analytic components of the Graduate Record Examination (GRE)
Note: This program does not lead to initial teacher licensure.

The program admission process must be completed within one calendar year. Failure to do so will result in reclassification as a non-degree student. Reinstatement to degree-seeking status will require a new application for admission. Courses taken prior to full admission will not necessarily be accepted toward meeting degree requirements.
