The Master of Arts with a major in Secondary Education is designed to serve the need for advanced study at the graduate level by middle, junior and senior high school teachers and is built upon the Model of the Teacher as Competent Professional Educator. The objective of the degree is to enhance the teaching and organizational ability of the candidate and thus improve classroom instruction.

This program is an online graduate degree that offers two emphasis areas: Educational Studies and Educational Technology. The Educational Studies graduate degree is designed to help classroom teachers deepen their teaching skills and knowledge in their field of expertise or expand their expertise in the area Educational Technology. This graduate program does not lead to an initial teaching certification, but it assists you to become a leader in your field of expertise.

Admission Requirements

1. Undergraduate GPA of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale

Applicants who are denied admission can appeal to the College of Education, Health and Human Studies Admission Appeals Committee, which is composed of one representative from each program offering a graduate program.

Graduation Requirement

The student must attain an overall GPA of 3.25 in order to graduate from the program.

Educational Studies
