General Education Requirements - some requirements may be fulfilled by coursework in major program

A "Milestone" signifies a significant stage for a student in the completion of a degree.

Degree requirements for all students: a minimum of 120 credit hours, completion of the General Education program, and completion of 39 senior division hours (300599). Refer to the Undergraduate Bulletin or Degree Works for additional graduation requirements for your program.

A minimum 3.0 GPA in the major and overall are required to graduate with a BFA degree and a grade of $C$ or better in all art courses in the major.

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After completing the Art course requirements, students will choose one specialty area. The BFA Art specialty areas include Photography \& New Media, Graphic \& Interactive Design, Sculpture, Painting, Printmaking, and Ceramics. The requirements for each art specialization are listed in the tables below.
