Degree Requirements

The degree requirements in Communication Disorders are designed to meet the academic and clinical standards established by the Council for Academic Accreditation (CAA) of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association. Completion of the degree requirements constitutes one component toward the establishment of the student's eligibility for the Certificate of Clinical Competence in Speech-Language Pathology (CCC-SLP).

It is the student's responsibility to confer with his/her academic advisor regarding recent changes (if any) in academic or clinical standards. Also, it is the student's responsibility to complete any additional requirements for the CCC-SLP beyond completion of the degree and to submit proper documentation of all required components.

Admission Requirements

Application procedures are detailed on the departmental website at https://semo.edu/colleges-departments/education-health/communication-disorders/graduate-info/index.html. Admission is considered only for the summer semester. Domestic applicants must submit their application materials to the Communication Sciences and Disorders Computerized Application System (CSDCAS). International applicants must submit an international application at semo.edu/apply, in addition to completing the CSDCAS application. In addition to the criteria established for general admission to graduate studies, applicants must have the following:

- An undergraduate degree in Communication Disorders (or equivalent area) from a regionally accredited college or university
- **2.** A minimum overall undergraduate GPA of 3.0 <u>OR</u> a minimum average GPA of 3.0 across all communication disorders courses.

Note: Applicants with undergraduate majors in disciplines other than communication disorders must meet the same criteria for all graduate students indicated above and demonstrate that they will have completed the required core of undergraduate courses prior to the start date for the program. Applicants with undergraduate majors in disciplines other than communication disorders should contact the department for a meeting with a graduate advisor.

Applicants must also submit the following documents via CSDCAS: two letters of recommendation, resume, personal statement

International applicants must also have a minimum IELTS Academic score of 7.0, TOEFL iBT score of 95, PTE Academic score of 64 or Duolingo English score of 125. This requirement is for non-United States citizens who are not native English speakers. Students from countries where English is known to be the official language of education are exempt from English proficiency verification. For a complete list of countries, visit
