Degree requirements: a minimum of 90 credit hours, completion of the General Education program, and completion of 39 senior division hours (300-599). Refer to the Undergraduate Bulletin or Degree Works for additional graduation requirements for your program.

Personalized Pathways: Courses are offered in a traditional 16-week fall and spring semesters, with 8-week sessions in the first and last half of both. In addition, we offer at least six different 4-, 6-, and 8-week sessions over summer. Talk with an advisor to see how you can utilize these different sessions to expedite your degree completion.

A minimum 2.0 GPA in the major and overall are required to graduate with a BS degree.
