GUEST ARTIST



ANDRÈ HAYWARD is an extremely gifted trombonist with the sound and clarity reminiscent of the late J.J. Johnson. His gospel-tinged approach is refreshing and will warm the hearts of anyone he comes in contact with.

Born in Houston, Texas in 1973, Hayward's first exposure to the world of music was through his parents, Melvin and Barbara Hayward, where musical talent exists on both sides. Hayward began playing trombone and tuba at the age of 11 under the tutelage of Leon Schreiber and two years later with Bob Odneal who was lead trumpeter for Maynard Ferguson. Hayward continued playing through high

school where he attended the High School for Performing and Visual Arts under the direction of notable jazz educator, Robert "Doc" Morgan. He continued to hone his skills with Houston's legendary educator, Conrad O. Johnson. It was Conrad's instruction, and the opportunity to work in his big band, "The Big Blue Sound," where he really started to gain experience working in an ensemble.

He landed his first engagement with trumpeter Roy Hargrove for a European tour after being heard at a jam session during a festival while playing with the Texas Southern University Jazz Ensemble. After Hargrove, Hayward performed and recorded with singer/band leader Betty Carter for five years in her acclaimed "Jazz Ahead" program. Other acclaimed performers include Joe Williams, Slide Hampton, John Lewis, Mingus Dynasty Big Band, Gerald Wilson, Kirk Whalum, Jimmy Heath, The Duke Ellington Orchestra and Illinois Jacquet's Big Band. His most recent performance credits are The Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra, The San Francisco Jazz Collective and The Clayton - Hamilton Jazz Orchestra.

In 2003, he received first place and a \$20,000 scholarship at the International Thelonious Monk Trombone Competition in Washington, DC. Hayward is also an educator who has conducted numerous clinics and workshops in various parts of the U.S. and overseas.

Hayward has served as jazz trombone professor at New School of Jazz & Contemporary Music, New York University, New England Conservatory, Michigan State University, University of Texas - Butler School of Music and University of North Texas.



About the Director

Joseph L. Jefferson is the assistant professor of applied trombone and director of jazz studies at Southeast Missouri State University. As a trombonist an educator, Joseph maintains an active performance schedule as a soloist in classical, jazz and commercial musical settings both nationally and internationally.

Prior to moving to Missouri, Joseph performed regularly with the Portland Jazz Composers Ensemble as well as the Rose City Trombones. Additionally, he maintained an active freelance schedule throughout the Pacific Northwest. He has also served as second trombonist for the Tidewater Winds; a professional wind ensemble that performs in the "Sousa Band" tradition. In the classical genre, Joseph has performed with world-renowned artists and groups, such as: The Irish Tenors, U.S. Army Continental Band, American Guild of Organist Brass Ensemble and with John Phillip Sousa IV, to name a few. As a jazz/commercial musician, he has performed with the Stuart Dempster, Louis Romanos Quartet, Jae Sinnett, Mike Berkowitz, Mark Michelson Big Band, Randy Brecker, Slide Hampton, The Fuzz Band, Sinatra at the Sands Big Band Review, and the Treasure Valley Swing Band. Commercially, he has performed with "Right On" - The Worlds Greatest Show Band and 10 Spot Variety Band. Joseph has also performed with international R&B artists Dwele, Jon Bibbs and Raheem Devaughn. As a collaborative artist, he has worked with renowned Oregon poet, Lawson Inada, for an evening of jazz and poetry. As a soloist, Joseph has performed with the Fruitland Wind Ensemble as well as the Treasure Valley Wind Symphony. He has also premiered compositions by Stuart Dempster, Andrew Durkin, James Hosay and Robert Senay.

Joseph has held faculty positions at the University of Portland, Treasure Valley CC, Boise State University - Jazz Combo Camp (Trombone), Tidewater CC and John Handley High School. Dr. Jefferson has earned degrees from West Virginia University (D.M.A.), Shenandoah Conservatory (M.M.) and Norfolk State University (B.M.) Joseph's primary teachers include Dr. Keith Jackson, Dr. Wayne Wells, Dr. Mike Hall and Mr. Paul Adams. He has also studied with Andre Hayward, Dr. Natalie Mannix, Ron Barron, Delfeayo Marsalis, David Vining, Amanda Stewart and Donna Parkes.

Dr. Joseph L. Jefferson is an active member of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, Kappa Kappa Psi National Honorary Band Fraternity Inc., Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity Inc., International Trombone Association, Texas Music Educators Association, and the College Music Society and is available as a soloist, clinician or adjudicator.







ABOUT THE FEATURED ARTIST

MIKE TOMARO has been the director of the jazz studies program at the Mary Pappert School of Music at Duquesne University in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. since 1997. He is a saxophonist, composer, arranger, and educator and earned his B.S. in music education from Duquesne University and his M.A. in saxophone performance from George Mason University in Fairfax, Viginia. Prior to his appointment at Duquesne, he lived in the Washington, D.C., area for 17 years as a member of the Army Blues Jazz Ensemble, a unit of the prestigious "Pershing's Own" U.S. Army Band. While a member of this group, he served as its enlisted musical director and performed for presidents Reagan, Bush, and Clinton, as well as heads of state from around the world. He also composed and/or arranged much of the Army Blues repertoire and was featured as a soloist on several of the group's albums and CDs. Tomaro is a Yamaha Performing Artist and endorses Vandoren reeds, mouthpieces, and ligatures exclusively.

As a performer, Tomaro has worked with diverse artists and groups, such as Rosemary Clooney, Ray Charles, Michael Feinstein, Linda Ronstadt, Debby Boone, Johnny Mathis, Wayne Bergeron, Terence Blanchard, Louis Bellson, Terry Gibbs, Dizzy Gillespie Tribute Big Band, Woody Herman Orchestra, and the Smithsonian Jazz Masterworks Orchestra, where he is featured on their DVD, "Live at MCG." In his hometown, he has performed with guitarist Joe Negri, Pittsburgh Jazz Legacy Band, Pittsburgh Symphony, River City Brass Band, Pittsburgh Ballet, and Pittsburgh New Music Ensemble in addition to leading his own small groups.

Tomaro is the co-artistic director, with trumpeter Sean Jones, and lead alto player of the Pittsburgh Jazz Orchestra, the city's premier big band, where he composes and arranges most of the material that group performs. In 2015, the band released its first CD, "Joyful Jazz," on the MCG Jazz label; the album contains 11 arrangements by Tomaro. It has garnered rave reviews including a four-star rating in *Downbeat* magazine and was selected as one of the top seven holiday albums of 2015 by the *Wall Street Journal*.

Tomaro has four nationally released recordings under his own name that showcase his talents as both performer and composer/arranger – "Dancing Eyes" (Seabreeze Jazz), "Home Again" (Positive Music), "Forgotten Dreams" (Seabreeze Jazz), and "Nightowl Suite" (Seabreeze Jazz). Additionally, Tomaro has been featured on many other CDs as a performer and/or arranger, most notably on Nancy Wilson's last two Grammy award-winning releases, "Turned To Blue" and "RSVP;" the Bob Mintzer Big Band's Grammy-nominated release, "For The Moment;" Ann Hampton Callaway's "The Hope Of Christmas;" New York Voices' "A Day Like This;" Sheryl Bailey's "A New Promise;" and the 21st Century Swing Band's "Pittsburgh Jazz Legacy," all on the MCG Jazz label. On the last two releases, Tomaro is prominently featured as the main arranger, as well as a soloist.

Tomaro's music has been performed by the likes of jazz greats David Liebman, Wayne Bergeron, Ivan Lins, Claudio Roditi, Mike Stern, Ernie Watts, Bobby Shew, Randy Brecker, New York Voices, and Al Vizzutti, as well as high schools, colleges, and universities around the world. His orchestral arrangements have been performed by the Pittsburgh and National Symphony orchestras. Over 200 of his compositions and arrangements have been published by Doug Beach Music, Hal Leonard Publications, and Walrus Music. In 2009, Tomaro scored all the music for MCG/Opera Theater of Pittsburgh's production of Duke Ellington's musical *Beggar's Holiday*.

Additionally, he has co-authored the textbook "Instrumental Jazz Arranging: A Comprehensive and Practical Guide" (Hal Leonard Publications), with his long-time mentor, Dr. John Wilson, who was director of jazz studies at Duquesne University from 1972-1996.

Tomaro is affiliated with the American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers where he has received several ASCAP Plus awards, the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences (NARAS), Jazz Education Network (JEN), and the National Association for Music Education (NAfME). He is in great demand both nationally and internationally as a guest soloist, adjudica-tor, and clinician. For more information on his activities, visit his website at miketomaro.com.

Since his wife's passing from pancreatic cancer in 2010, Tomaro has been dedicating much of his time to organizing, arranging, and performing yearly concerts designed to benefit the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network (PANCAN).



ABOUT THE FEATURED ARTIST

CRAIG FRAEDRICH Jazz artist Craig Fraedrich has enjoyed a professional career as a performer and educator that spans over thirty years. He received his undergraduate degree in Jazz Performance from North Texas State University and master's from Arizona State University. He also studied at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and the Banff Center for the Arts. He was awarded music scholarships at each of these institutions. While in college he won numerous solo awards at jazz festivals throughout the country including: The Elmhurst Jazz Festival, The Notre Dame Jazz Festival, The Wichita Jazz Festival, The UT-Austin Jazz Festival, The University of Arizona – Flagstaff Jazz Festival and the University of California – Berklee Jazz Festival where he was named the outstanding soloist of the festival. He was a winner of International Trumpet Guild Jazz Solo competition and leader/director of the first student combo to perform at the International Jazz Educators Conference.

From 1986 to 2017 he performed as a featured jazz trumpet soloist with The Army Blues, the premier jazz ensemble of the United States Army and one of the few full-time jazz ensembles in the country. During that time he also served as the group's musical director, trumpet section leader and assistant group leader. In addition to performing, he has composed or arranged over 100 pieces for the band. As a member of this prestigious ensemble, Fraedrich has traveled extensively both performing and serving as a clinician. In addition to visiting much of the United States, he has performed in Australia, Japan, Sweden, Norway, Germany, China, Ireland, St. Thomas and at the Montreux Jazz Festival in Switzerland. He finished his career as a Sergeant Major, serving as the leader of the Army Blues and Element Leader of the Popular Music Element.

Fraedrich has pursued a significant solo career as well. He has released twelve compact discs with his own groups and has appeared on dozens of others as a side-man. His release, So In Love (featuring NEA Jazz Master Dave Liebman) reached number twelve in national jazz radio play according to Billboard Magazine. His three most recent releases, Alone Together, Out of the Blues and All Through the Night on Summit Records, are available on CD Baby, I-Tunes, Amazon and most streaming outlets. Other performance highlights have included an appearance as guest jazz soloist with the Brass Band of Battle Creek for the premier of Wycliff Gordon's "Tribute to Muhammad Ali" as well as the Kennedy Center's presentation of Ramsey Lewis's "Proclamation of Hope", both of which were recorded for PBS. Craig continues to maintain a busy schedule in the Washington D.C. area. He is a dedicated educator and has been a faculty member (Associate Professor) at the Shenandoah Conservatory of Music since 1989 and was a Lecturer at West Virginia University from 2013 to 2016. His duties have included: teaching Applied Jazz Trumpet, Jazz Coaching (applied jazz lessons for any instrument) Music Theory, Jazz Theory, Jazz Arranging and Composition, Jazz Improvisation, Jazz Combos, the Little Big Band and has been the director of the Shenandoah Jazz Ensemble since 1999. Highlights directing the Jazz Ensemble included tours of Senegal West Africa with performances culminating at the St. Louis Jazz Festival and a tour of Ireland with a featured performance at the National Concert Hall.

Fraedrich has published eight jazz method books including three books as part of the Practical Jazz Theory for Improvisation series. He has studied improvisation with Dave Liebman, Kenny Wheeler, Chuck Marohnic, Rich Matteson, Dan Hearle, Jack Peterson, and Frank Puzzullo. Additionally, he cites the remaining faculty at the Banff Centre for the Arts (1985- Dave Holland, John Abercrombie, Don Thompson, Marvin "Smitty" Smith, and Julian Priester) as major influences. His principal trumpet teachers have included Dennis Najoom, Dr. Leonard Candelaria, Don Jacoby, Dr. Wayne Cook, Steve Kossoris, Chuck Tumlinson and Ken Van Winkle.

ABOUT THE FEATURED ARTIST

Saxophonist, Composer and Educator **SHAREL CASSITY** (pron. "Sha-Relle") is prominent on the New York and Chicago jazz scenes. Listed as "Rising Star Alto Saxophone" in Downbeat Magazine for the past 12 years, Sharel has appeared on the Today Show, Good Morning America, The Colbert Show, is in the Oklahoma Jazz Hall of Fame, and is a recipient of the ASCAP Young Jazz Composers Award.

Sharel has worked with Multi-Grammy Award-winning artist Jennifer Hudson; Top 40 hit singer-songwriter Natalie Merchant, Aretha Franklin, Vanessa Williams, Trisha Yearwood, Ruben Blades, & DJ Logic among others. Sharel has also worked with NEA Jazz Masters Herbie Hancock, Wynton Marsalis, Dee Dee Bridgewater, Jimmy Heath, and Christian McBride; she has also appeared as a guest soloist with the Cincinnati Pops Orchestra. As a bandleader, Sharel's five albums have received top-rated reviews in publications like the Chicago Tribune, New York Times, JazzTimes, Jazziz, Downbeat & American Indian News, & Saxophone Journal. Cassity runs her record label "Relsha Music" and directs the educational program "Jazz Up."

A skilled and versatile sideman, Sharel is a current member of the Dizzy Gillespie Latin Experience and All-Star Big Band. She has also performed frequently alongside renowned Grammy-winning artists Roy Hargrove, Nicholas Payton, Lewis Nash, Joe Chambers & Darcy James Argue. Sharel has toured 24 countries and performed at leading venues like the Newport Jazz Festival, Monterey Jazz Festival & the North Sea Jazz Festival. Additionally, Sharel was lead alto in the Diva Jazz Orchestra from 2007-2014 and performed in Wynton Marsalis' Broadway musical After Midnight.

Selected to attend The Juilliard School under full scholarship for a Masters in Music, Sharel earned her BFA from The New School for Jazz & Contemporary Music in 2005.

Sharel appears in publications "I Walked with Giants" by Jimmy Heath, "Three Generations Under the Lens" by Adrianna Mateo, and "Freedom of Expression: Interviews with Women in Jazz" by Chris Becker. Sharel is also alumni of IAJE Sisters in Jazz, Betty Carter's Jazz Ahead, and the Ravinia Summer Residency.

Steeped in the classical tradition, Sharel placed third in the Disney International Piano Concerto Competition at 10 and was offered a full scholarship to North Texas State University for classical saxophone at 18.

Moving frequently throughout her childhood, Sharel graduated high school in Yukon, Oklahoma. In 2000 she moved to New York City and relocated to Chicago in 2017 with her family. Currently, Cassity is a professor in the Chicago area at Columbia College, DePaul University & Elgin Community College. Sharel is a proud Yamaha and Vandoren Performing Artist.
