Important Changes

Changes in Admission to TPP

The required GPA for admission to TPP has changed from 2.75 to 2.5. Effective July 1, 2025.

Changes in Graduation Requirements

- A 3.0 GPA in pedagogy coursework is required for all Education majors.
- A 2.5 GPA in content coursework is required for all middle school, secondary, and K-12 programs except Exceptional Child K-12, Music K-12 and Social Studies 9-12, which require a 3.0 GPA in content coursework.

Changes in Teacher Certification

- **A final 3.0 GPA in pedagogy coursework is required for all Education majors. A final 2.5 GPA in content coursework is required for all middle school, secondary, and K-12 programs (excluding Exceptional Child K-12).**
- A passing score on the appropriate licensure exam(s) as required by the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education.
- A passing score on the Teacher Candidate Instrument of the Missouri Educator Evaluation System.
- MSHF/FBI background clearance from no earlier than one year prior to the date of the application for certification.

Praxis

Test Registration Reminders

When registering for Praxis exams, please remember the following:

- When you register for your Praxis exam(s), be sure to select Southeast Missouri State University so that your scores will be sent to Ms. Lincoln in a timely manner.
- Include your **Social Security Number** when creating a profile. This is currently listed as optional on the site but in order for DESE's certification system to connect scores to an individual, they need an SSN tied to them. We are working with ETS to change the language on the site to reflect that this is a requirement for Missouri.
- Test takers receive a free Interactive Practice Test when they purchase their exam. This free practice test does not show in your cart until close to the end of the checkout process. There are pop-ups to add on extra practice tests or study material prior to the free test showing in your cart.

- When taking the test at home, Microsoft Edge is the preferred browser. Customer Service advised that using Microsoft Edge resolves some of the technical issues one may encounter when registering.

Candidate Status & Certification

Changes in Illinois Educator Licensure (Initial Certification)

All educators are now required to pass the Illinois content test prior to receiving the professional educator license (PEL), including educators who are pursuing the reciprocity route to licensure. The Illinois State Board of Education will begin incorporating the four topics required for initial licensure (Methods of Teaching Special Education, Methods of Teaching Reading, Reading in the Content Area, and Methods of Teaching English Learners) into a test that will be required as part of initial licensure. This will go into effect on **January 1, 2026**. For more information, please stop by the Office of Educator Preparation.

Field Experiences Office

Student Entering Student Teaching in the Next Semester

With the extreme teacher shortage, many students are applying for jobs prior to student teaching. Please understand that all requirements for the student teaching placement remain in effect. (Student Teaching MAP, certification requirements, etc. as per the handbook). If a district contacts a student regarding employment, please notify the Field Office before interviewing for a position. There are many pieces that must be in place for the student to qualify for certification at the end of their culminating experience. The Field Office needs to ensure that all requirements are met before a student signs a contract.

Important Field Transportation Information

Students enrolled in field coursework are responsible for their own transportation. Questions concerning transportation may be referred to the instructors or the Office of Field Experiences.

Triad Information

Triad attendance is mandatory and must be attended at the beginning of the semester of student teaching. If you are a student teaching in the spring semester, it is an absolute requirement that you attend one of the Triad sessions.

Upcoming Triad Dates for Student Teaching

Students must complete the Triad meeting (the university supervisor, the mentor teacher, and the student) PRIOR to beginning the student teaching experience. In Student Teaching, students will follow the assigned school district's schedule. Triad dates have been set in advance to provide plenty of opportunities to avoid conflicts. Triads are usually held in Cape, Sikeston, and St. Louis. Times and places are not set as we are unable to secure rooms in advance.

Spring 2026 – January 5, 6, and 7

Fall 2026 – August 12, 13, and 14
Spring 2027 – January 5, 6, and 7
Fall 2027 – August 17, 18, and 19

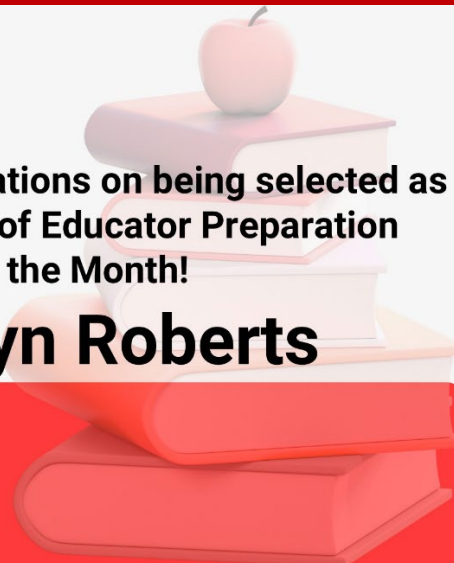

Scholarships

2025-2026 MARE Scholarship

The Missouri Association of Rural Education offers two scholarship programs for students interested in becoming teachers and returning to rural school districts to teach. The first program is the MARE Rural Missouri Scholarship Fund. This program is open to only junior and senior level students attending Missouri colleges or universities that offer degrees in education. Applicants must have completed 60 or more credit hours and have declared a major in education. Last year, MARE provided twenty-two (22) \$1,000.00 scholarships.
