New 90% Online Blended Option Elementary Education B.S. Degree Program – Pass the Word!

Southeast Missouri State University is introducing in the fall of 2024 the new 90% online blended and 10% Zoom option for earning a B.S. degree in Elementary Education. Students currently have online options for their freshman/sophomore classes; however, the new option for Elementary Education will allow students to complete junior/senior level classes in the Literacy, Content, and Advanced Blocks through 90% online and 10% Zoom. Students will meet through Zoom three (3) times per semester during the 1st, 8th, and 15th weeks in afternoon/evening so that working and non-traditional students will have the option to obtain their Elementary Education degree. Students will still be required to earn their field hours (TBA) and student teaching in person.

Background Checks

If you are planning to do field work in PreK-12 school buildings during the Spring 2024 semester, you are required to have an up-to-date fingerprint background check on file with the Teacher Preparation Program. Field work courses include CE364, CE480, ED280, EL314, EL350, EL430, EL480, EX309, EX480, ME222, ME270, SE355, SE380, SE465, and any other course that requires field work in a school. (If you previously obtained a background check for the Southeast Missouri State University Teacher Preparation Program, it has not expired.) To see if your background check is up to date with the Teacher Preparation Program you can find this information in your Support Net Notes section. New – Ozarks Teacher Corps Scholarship – Due by April 14

The Ozarks Teacher Corps Scholarship, administered by the Community Foundation of the Ozarks, opened for applications in January for the school year 2024-25. This scholarship has unique criteria that may apply to students you know:

- Eight \$4,000.00 scholarships; two from each school listed below
- Renewable for an additional one year; providing you maintain 3.0 GPA and are enrolled in 12 credit hours
- Student must be enrolled at Drury University, Missouri State University, Missouri Southern State University or **Southeast Missouri State University**
- Current college student entering their junior or senior year, majoring in education
- GPA of 3.0 or above; submit transcript
- Agree to attend two mandatory professional development workshops (one in fall and one in spring)
- Student must have graduated from a rural Missouri high school
- After graduating, student must agree to teach for at least three years in a rural community
- Essay required
- Letter of recommendation from a professor in the Education department at your university
- If selected, you will be expected to sign a letter of commitment outlining the responsibilities and expectations of the Ozark Teacher Corps scholarship recipient which is listed in the above criteria
