Ideas Department Head is responsible for coordinating all activities related to writing, reading, history and culture. This includes proper preparation and training of staff within the Ideas department. This position also serves as a supervisor within camp and will be expected to fulfill supervisory duties beyond department area.

- Minimum 21 years old
- Valid Class E Driver's license
- Experience in education of children in relation to writing, reading, history, culture and other specialty knowledge
- Interpersonal skills, especially with regards to accepting guidance and feedback
- Organizational, written and verbal communication skills
- Ability to provide a safe environment and proper care for campers
- Basic understanding and knowledge of working with children
- Ability to plan and implement activities for maximum effectiveness
- Ability to effectively assess levels of student achievement, analyze results, and prescribe action for improvement
- Ability to work and navigate in a variety of environments and weather conditions

Salary

Salary is based on education, experience, and qualifications ranging from \$2300 - 2600. It includes room and board for the duration of employment.
