/Associate of Science in Nursing to Bachelor of Science in Nursing (Online)

Students are encouraged to complete the Associate of Science Degree in Nursing (ASN) at Three Rivers College to prepare for a smooth transition to a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing (BSN) at Southeast Missouri State University.

- The nursing program at Southeast Missouri State University is accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE)
- Students can finish their BSN in as little as one year if all general education is completed at Three Rivers College
- Courses are taught by qualified nursing professionals
- Field Experiences are tailored to the student's specific interests

- Current RN licensure
- Cumulative 2.8 GPA
- Chemistry, Microbiology*, Anatomy & Physiology, English Composition II, and completion of all required documentation through CastleBranch as outlined in the RN-BSN Handbook <http://www.semo.edu/pdf/Nursing-RN-BSN-Handbook.pdf>

Students must be admitted to the nursing program prior to taking any nursing courses. You do not have to complete all general education courses prior to starting the nursing courses.
