Sport Management

The Bachelor of Science in Sport Management degree is the first in Missouri to have COSMA accreditation.



The program is unique in having a required business administration minor and every sport management course involves a practical component.

Students gain experience in NCAA Division I athletics, an active student recreation program that features two recreation centers, as well as multiple golf courses in the area.

Sport Management students will...

- Gain practical experience through class projects, practica and internships.
- Interact with qualified faculty in a small class environment.
- Receive career and academic advising from faculty members.

Career Planning

Career preparation is part of the mission of Southeast. In fact, more than 90% of Southeast students participate in internships, clinical opportunities, student teaching, research assistantships, and study abroad.

Currently, 73% of students find a job in sport management within a year of graduation or continue on to graduate school. This is due to the fact that all sport management students must take the professional seminar in sport management course (SM 465). The course is designed to help students examine their professional goals, set priorities for their internship and understand the process of preparing for job interviews.

Professional career counselors are available for all students. The Office of Career Services in Academic Hall 057 can provide students with professional career counseling, resume critiques, practice interviews, job search strategies, career events, networking opportunities, and more.
