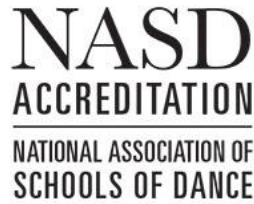


Bachelor of Arts (BA)

Dance (BA)

The B.A. in Dance gives students a broad-based education and training in dance allowing students the flexibility to explore any and all aspects of dance and the performing arts. The degree combines a theoretical and analytical approach to understanding dance and performance with a practical approach through experiential learning.



The program allows students to combine dance training with another discipline or area of study to prepare them for careers not specifically within the professional world of dance performance. For example, students may combine the B.A. in Dance with a minor in entrepreneurship to prepare for careers in administrative and management fields. Students might also combine a B.A. in Dance with a double major in Exercise Science for a career in physical therapy or athletic training for dance. The degree also serves to prepare students interested in continuing their studies at the graduate level.

What You'll Do . . .

/ Training. Students in Dance train with experienced faculty in areas of ballet, jazz, and modern achieving a high level of competency and skill.

/ Performance. Opportunities in one mainstage dance concert, two second stage dance concerts, two mainstage musicals, and one second stage musical, as well as a number of plays, cabarets, showcases, and so on.

/ Career Development. BA in Dance students prepare for rewarding careers as professionals in the dance industry. Southeast dance graduates are employed as professional dancers, choreographers, teachers and artists in cities such as New York, Chicago, St. Louis and on cruise ships.

/ Housing. Majors in Dance study and train in the beautiful River Campus, a multimillion-dollar facility devoted to the visual and performing arts.

/ Guest Artists. 100% of Southeast programs offer a real-world experience. BA in Dance students benefit from an established program of collaboration with professional guest dancers and choreographers.

/ Networking. Students are given the opportunity to establish relationships with professional dancers, choreographers and dance companies through internships, intensives, and dance festivals.
