1. Effective fall 2011, all accounting majors must have a grade of 'A' or 'B' in both AC221 and AC222. The Department of Accounting at Southeast recommends that both accounting courses be completed at the same institution.
2. ENG 102 and ENG 103 both transfer in as EN140. However, ENG 103 is allowed to count as the MG252 requirement for business majors who also transfer ENG 102 with a grade of 'C' or better.
3. Math186 Survey of Calculus (3 hours) or MTH210 Analytic Geometry & Calculus (5 hours) is accepted. MTH186 is recommended.

Change in Degree requirements:

Effective Fall 2013, MA 139 Applied Calculus is no longer required, as students will take a second business statistics course instead of Applied Calculus. Students who have consecutive enrollment from STLCC to Southeast will be under degree requirements that were in place when starting at STLCC. **Therefore, students who start at STLCC in fall 2013 or later will not need Applied Calculus and will be required to take two business statistics courses. Students who start at STLCC prior to fall 2013 will need Applied Calculus and one business statistics course.**

Admission requirements for the Harrison College of Business include completion of all lower level core and support courses with a grade of 'C' or better, completion of 60 hours (junior standing), and a minimum 2.25 overall GPA. Students must be admitted to enroll in upper level (300-500) business courses. Requirements for the BSBA degree are at www5.semo.edu/cobadvising.
