

Southwestern Illinois College Courses Which Meet University Studies Requirements at Southeast Missouri State University

Students who complete an Associate of Arts degree or Associate of Science from SWIC have completed the lower-level University Studies (general education) courses at Southeast with the following exceptions:

1. Must complete PS220 Missouri Government for 1 hour at Southeast if either POLS150 or POLS261 is taken at SWIC or PS103 (3 hours) if either POLS150 or POLS261 is not transferred.
2. Must complete a course that is listed below as Logical Systems requirement
3. Must have at least 9 credit hours of Humanities or Social Science courses
