Title: Parent and youth satisfaction with children's mental health services

Methodology: Quantitative and qualitative. I matched 545 family pairs (a youth aged 12-18 and his or her own parent) and compared their satisfaction and perceived outcomes of services. I developed a regression model using SPSS based on youth answers on the survey, to predict youth satisfaction with case management services. I interviewed 12 parents and 15 youth about their experiences with case management, focusing on what contributed to satisfaction or dissatisfaction with those services. The qualitative portion used the Atlas-ti program for qualitative data analysis.

I coordinated the Kansas Consumer Satisfaction Survey for Children's Mental Health. I participated in the development of the Kansas Families Satisfaction Survey (KFSS) and the Kansas Youth Satisfaction Survey (KYSS) instruments, and in their revisions in 1999, 2003 and 2004-5. I obtained consumer names from mental health centers or Medicaid records, forwarded this information to a consumer group that did the telephone interviews, and tracked the interviews as they returned. I mailed surveys to those families who could not be reached by telephone. I prepared interim reports to the community mental

health centers of Kansas (as soon as the data were collected on each center). I performed the data analysis for both the quantitative and qualitative sections of the annual report, which compared the twenty-seven centers to each other and looked for predictors of family and youth satisfaction.
