Dear Redhawk Community,

Today is an important day for Missouri residents. Anyone 16 and older is now eligible to receive a COVID-19 vaccine. That means ***all Southeast Missouri State University faculty, staff and students can receive the vaccine.***

Over the past year, we have worked closely with the Cape Girardeau Public Health Center and other state and local entities to keep our community safe through the Protect the Nest Plan and other efforts. Most recently we have provided information on vaccination clinics and assisted the public health center in coordinating vaccination events at the Show Me Center and Student Recreation Center.

As you know, we are also making plans to return to normal, as much as possible, for the Fall 2021 semester. For example, classroom capacities are now set at pre-pandemic levels, and the course delivery modes offered are the same as before the pandemic. One way to keep this momentum going is to vaccinate as many members of our community as possible.

There are many online resources for vaccinations. First and foremost, we encourage you to use the Missouri COVID-19 Vaccine Navigator website to learn more and to determine your comfort level with receiving the vaccine.
