Successful completion of:

- MO Pre-Service Teacher Assessment (MoPTA)

A minimum of 30 credit hours must be taken in residence (at Southeast) which could result in needing additional credit hours. In addition, 39 upper-division courses numbered at or above the 300-level are required for graduation (must be taken at a four year institution).
