Successful completion of:

- Missouri Content Exam (Mild/Moderate Cross Categorical (050) AND Elementary Education 007-010)
- MO Pre-Service Teacher Assessment (MoPTA)

A minimum of 30 credit hours must be taken in residence (at Southeast) which could result in needing additional credit hours. In addition, 39 upper-division courses numbered at or above the 300-level are required for graduation (must be taken at a four year institution).

Students should refer to Southeast's Undergraduate Bulletin and online advising system for all current degree requirements (e.g., admission requirements to the College of Education, GPA, and writing examination).
