Students are encouraged to complete the Associate of Science Degree in Nursing (AS) at Mineral Area College to prepare for a smooth transition to a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing (BSN) at Southeast Missouri State University.

- The nursing program at Southeast Missouri State University is accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE)
- Finish in as little as one year if you complete all general education at Mineral Area College
- Courses are taught by qualified nursing professionals

- Cumulative 2.5 GPA
- Chemistry, Microbiology, Anatomy & Physiology I and II, English Composition II, and completion of all required documentation through CastleBranch as outlined in the RN-BSN Handbook <http://www.semo.edu/pdf/Nursing-RN-BSN-Handbook.pdf>

Students must be admitted to the nursing program prior to taking any nursing courses. You do not have to complete all general education courses prior to starting the nursing courses.
